



Fast fashion is a design, manufacturing, and marketing method of fast pace trending fashion rapidly producing high volumes of cheap clothing

Environmental Problems

Carbon emissions

- Emits 1.2 billion tons of carbon dioxide in total
- Carbon emissions causes global warming







- Plastic microfibers are used in textiles such as polyester and nylon when making clothes
- Every year a half a million tons of plastic microfibers are dumped into the ocean, the
 equivalent of 50 billion plastic bottles. Microfibers are released to the oceans get eaten by
 marine animals. Microfibers are extremely harmful to marine animals because plastic is not
 easily degradable













Waste of large amounts of water:

- Second largest water supply in the world
- Reduces access to clean drinking water to communities
- Every year the fashion industry uses 93 billion cubic meters of water which is enough water to fulfill the water consumption of five million people


<u>Landfill:</u>


- Contains toxins (methane, carbon dioxide, acids, and more)
- Creates **greenhouse gases**
- Of the total fiber input used for clothing, 87 % is incinerated or disposed of in a landfill
- 11 million tons of clothing is thrown away every year just in the U.S, and these clothes cannot be easily recycled because of all the chemicals used in these clothings

Worker Inequality



- Workers are paid miserable wages
- Pays less than the **minimum legal salary**
- Fashion industry pays the workers **five times less** than the minimum living wage

Living wage:

The bare minimum that a family requires to fulfill the needs of food, rent, education, healthcare, transportation, clothing and savings.

- Endless working hours without extra payment
- Workers work with dangerous and toxic
 chemicals
- No ventilation
- Frequent use of child and forced labour

- Low quality clothing requires low skilled labour
- 2. Fast fashion companies pay them less
- 3. Workers such as young children are forced to work under these **poor and unethical conditions** to support their families; therefore workers cannot refuse more working hours.
- 4. Fast fashion companies **prohibits worker unions** to stop worker's rebellion.

 Most of the fashion industry manufactures in Asia: China, Vietnam, Bangladesh, India, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, and Cambodia.





Material

Look for:


- Organic/Recycled Cotton
- Organic Hemp
- Organic Linen
- Tencel
- Recycled Polyester (rPET)
- Econyl

Avoid:

- Polyester
- Rayon (Viscose)
- Nylon
- Acrylic
- Conventional Cotton

Unsustainable Fabric







Unsustainable fabric causes....

- Waste of large amounts of water
- Create **greenhouse gases**
- **Highly toxic chemicals** used which negatively affects the workers health and our skin health
- Non-biodegradable
- **Release of microplastic** when washing these clothes
- Deforestation

How can you take action in your daily lives?

- 1. **Mend or repair** clothing instead of buying new clothes
- 2. To ensure your clothing lasts longer, be sure to **launder on lower temperatures and line dry** when you can
- 3. **Buy** from sustainable clothing shops or second hand/thrift shops **ThredUp:** You can buy second hand clothing and sell second hand clothing here (https://www.thredup.com)

6. **Donate** your gently used clothes to organizations (a solution for post-COVID)

Why should you buy sustainable clothes?

- Sustainable clothes **last longer** than fast fashion clothes
- While sustainable clothes last 4 to 5 years, fast fashion clothes last as short as 1
 month to 1 year
- What is discounted from the clothes you buy will create more problems later
 (environmental problems, and low wages and dangerous working conditions for fashion industry
 workers)
