Data and Findings

African penguin population numbers have dropped 60% in the last 30 years and they are now considered Endangered. (georgia aquarium)

In 2019, approximately 13,300 pairs bred in South Africa: St Croix Island 3,638 pairs, Bird Island 2,378 pairs, Dassen Island 1,912 pairs, Stony Point 1,705 pairs, Robben Island 1,190 pairs(you may recognize this island as it was the island where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned), Dyer Island: 1,071 pairs, Simonstown: 932 pairs. (Data zone bird life)

There are only an estimated 120,000 of these animals left and that is decreasing because of a loss of food and habitat which is due to the expansion of commercial fishing. (a-z-animals)

African penguin answers

- 1) B. their voices sound like braying donkeys. Really, the best way to explain this is to let you listen.
- 2) True, the penguins are endangered. In 2010, the birds were uplisted from vulnerable to endangered on the IUCN red list because of recent, rapid populations decreases. IUCN data suggest fisheries and shifts in prey populations are playing a part.
- 3) C, up to 20 kilometers per hour. They also can travel up to a distance of 45 miles per trip. These penguins live in large colonies across southern Africa, as far north as Namibia on the west coast and Mozambique on the east coast.
- 4) D, 27. According to the University of Michigan Museum of Zoology, the average lifespan of one of these birds ranges from 10 to 27 years. Captive birds of this species typically live longer than those in the wild. This average age is on par with other similar penguins.
- True, the genders look extremely similar. Both males and females have short, broad, tightly spaced feathers to protect their skin from water. They also share similar markings, including a white belly topped with a black U-shaped band and a black back.
